National Shrine Basilica of

Our Lady of Las Lajas, Narino, Columbia



Considered the most beautiful church in Columbia, the National Shrine Basilica of Our Lady of Las Lajas was built between 1916 and 1949. It sits on a 130- feet tall bridge over the Guáitara River canyon.

The Las Lajas Sanctuary is famous for its stunning architecture, apparations of the Holy Virgin and a mysterious image, nobody knows the origins of.

It is believed that in 1754 Our Lady appeared to an Amerindian lady, Maria Meneses de Quiñones and her deaf-mute daughter Rosa, at the place where the church now stands, when they were caught in a storm.

As the women hid between the gigantic lajas (slab of rock), they saw an apparition of the Virgin Mary and Baby Jesus. Fearing ridicule by the villagers, Maria kept mum about this incident but they kept returning there to pray, though the apparitions never reoccurred. Later, Rosa died. As the village prepared for her funeral, Maria carried Rosa's body to the lajas and prayed. There, a miracle took place -Rosa was brought back to life, could speak and hear! When the astounded villagers, brought by Rosa to the place she was revived, there on the rock they



saw a brilliant, life-size image. This was a surprise to the mother and daughter, who had never seen that before! The image was of Our Lady giving the Rosary to St. Dominic and a friar's chord to St. Francis.

No one could explain the image or its mystery. Over time, people began to chip away at the rock but the image remained undisturbed. Later when the image was studied by geologists, they found no paint or pigment on the rock. And in spite of boring into it three feet deep, the image remained as it was!

Las Lajas Sanctuary received canonical coronation from the Vatican in 1952. And it was made a minor basilica in 1994.


the Holy Spirit are across the Bible, his clear and most evident intervention occurs on Pentecost. It is vividly and beautifully narrated in the second chapter of the Acts of the Apostles (Acts of the Apostles is also known as 'the Gospel of the Holy Spirit').

As a child, I was wonderstruck, even confused by the Holy Spirit. I was familiar with Jesus Christ and could easily grow in intimacy with him. So also with God, the loving Father. But it not that easy with God the Holy Spirit. I will try to share a few simple important things about the Holy Spirit that the Holy Bible teaches and that which I learnt from my own experience.

First of all, the Holy Spirit moulds and shapes us according to God's plan. The first verses of the Bible read thus: In the beginning God created the heaven and the

earth. The earth was void and formless and darkness covered the face of the deep; and the Spirit of God moved over the waters (Genesis the Holy Spirit descended upon Mother Mary 1:1-2). The word used in the original Hebrew text for moved is was brooding over (...the Spirit of God was brooding over the waters). We know that brooding is an act of giving birth; it is when the mother bird broods over the eggs for a period of time that new chicks are born. It is when the Spirit of God brooded

over the void and formless earth that the earth took shape and form! So it is still the work of the Holy Spirit that gives form and shape to each species in this universe according to God's plan; to each one of us. It is an amazing work of the Spirit. We can only remain wonderstruck at how he changes and forms people; and

uman organ transplantation is often reflected upon St. Damian and St. Cosman miraculously replacing the infected dying leg of a Roman deacon, Justinian from a recently deceased Ethiopian. Transplantation is process of moving one organ or tissue from one location to another, either in one's own body (Autotransplantation) or into another living organism (Allo- or Xeno-transplantation). Allo transplantation has helped save thousands of lives each year, while the number of patients waiting to receive organs has been exponentially increasing due to increasing incidence of organ failure associated to lifestyle and autoimmune

diseases. A category of

organ donation termed 'Living donation' in which, a family member who has similar blood group and tissue type donates a part of their liver or one kidney to their loved one has been critical in countries that do not have deceased donation. Children, teenagers and young adults have received livers, kidneys from their parents, grandparents (living donation) and from generous deceased donors to go ahead and have successful lives.

On the other hand, Good Samaritans have also donated one of their kidneys out of good faith to an unknown person they do not really know. This has been considered as one of the most gratifying moments of their lives.

Organ transplantation is rewarding, yet a challenge for healthcare and recipients. But transplantation can only be successful if organs and tissue are available for donation. Go ahead and register yourself as an organ donor! o


DARE TO BE SAINTS




Germaine embraced all her sufferings,






That winter's day, Germaine was chased into the village. But from her apron fresh summer flowers fell out. As a sign of forgiveness, she gave them to her step-mother.

Materials Required:

- 1. Cloth (old pair of jeans)
- 2. Scissors
- 3. Needle and thread



Procedure

- 1 Cut a leg off an old pair of jeans, up to the thighs. The bottom hem is not needed.
- Make sure the width of the cloth is at equal distance. You will need to measure from one side and cut away accordingly from the other side.
- 3 Now turn the cloth inside out and stitch, joining the lengths together.
- 4 Fold the cloth exactly in half, marking a line across the two closed sides. Stitch over this line, as shown in the picture.
- 5 Insert your hand into one of the open sides till you reach the stitched middle. Pull the cloth over from the other side, so that the two open sides are now overlapped.























Tips - \$\forall - \forall - \forall

- 6 Cut a long piece of cloth (1 inch width) to make the shoulder strap. Fold inside, along the length half way and then fold again. Stitch through with running stitch from one end to the other.
- 7 Now take the bag and find the crease where the stitch of the two sides meet. Fold one end of the string inside and stitch across with a running stitch.
- 8 When you reach the other side, insert other side of the string and stitch through the same way.
- 9 You may paint the bag using fabric paints, fabric qlitter, sequences, etc.

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






Early Life



Born in 1380 to upper-class parents in Siena, Italy.

St Bernardino lost his mother at age 3 and his father at age 7, he was cared for by his aunt afterward. His aunt taught him to seek consolation and security by trusting in God.

Youth

His love for God blossomed at a very young age and growing up, he was able to do great acts of sacrifice. His devotion to Our Lady and his love for purity helped in his active participation in prayer, liturgy, learning, charity service and evangelisation.



While serving at the hospital in Scala from 1397 to 1400, St Bernardino took charge of the entire hospital during the plague.

St. Bernardino of Siena (1380 - 1444)

Vocation




Joined the Franciscans of the Strict Observance in 1402 and was ordained in 1404.

He lived a life of solitude and prayer. Although he had a weak and hoarse voice, through the intercession of Mother Mary, his voice became so captivating and his preaching touched the lives of many. He is one of the greatest preachers of his time; Pope Pius II called him a 'Second Paul.'





St Bernardino was especially known for his devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus and devised a symbol - IHS - the first three letters of the name of Jesus in Greek, in Gothic letters on a blazing sun.





After four decades of preaching, he became sick while travelling but continued to preach till he lost his voice. He died on May 20, 1444.




St Bernardino was canonised in 1450, just 6 years after he died, numerous miracles having already been attributed to his intercession.







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respect, improve planning and time management skills. It also builds a strong work ethic and teamwork. Of course, young children love the bia feeling they get when they can help mommy and daddy do 'big people jobs'. Children need to understand what the chore is and what we expect of them. Be clear about what is considered a job well done: doing the dishes or simply a 'good try'. So take your time to teach children how to do chores and to establish expectations.

Children as young as two can be given household chores like helping take clothes out of the dryer, putting their clothes away, cleaning up after a meal by throwing away the paper napkins or wiping tables or counters, etc. Keep expectations realistic when children are very young or chores are new: the goal is establishing routine and teaching them responsibilities, rather than how clean the table is or how neatly folded the clothes are. Older children should be expected to do more. These chores can include some that take a little longer, require more effort, and are more complicated: setting or clearing off the dinner table, sorting or folding the laundry, washing the dishes, sweeping the kitchen, or taking out the garbage.

This month, let's dig into the secret, Work Together. People often lament that chores take up time they could be spending with their kids. But chores can actually create special moments between children and adults. Little ones who always want to help will feel important and receive a self-esteem boost, and moody teens may decide to open up over a shared task. Assigning children regular chores helps teach them

Your kids may also take pride in being considered mature enough to take care of themselves. So invite vour kids to work alongside as you work to complete household chores or special projects. This not only builds their rapport with you, but also their competence. Most importantly, chores help them learn life skills, reinforce

The 'Good Pope' St. John XXIII

ope St. John XXIII, who served as pope from 1958 to 1963 always kept his sense of humour, even while holding a position of such authority. His most famous joke came when a journalist innocently asked him,
